

Sunset Park and Hometown Pride

Hallelujah! If you're wondering what all the commotion is about at Sunset Park, ride by slowly and take a look. We got the parking pad poured!!! Thanks to a generous donation of fill dirt from Cemstone and the tire-less work of Russ Naeve and his hand-picked team of volunteers, the concrete hit the ground Friday, July 31st. Unless our little park is so popular that we need it for the overflow, the parking pad will alleviate the need to park on the street.

In mid-August, we anticipate pouring the Walking Trail which will be 6' wide x 6" thick and will go from the new parking lot towards the back left of the park, then turn right towards Hwy 3. The Walking Trail is a grant sponsored project that will unite all 9 communities within Pocahontas County and will benefit all of our citizens that wish to have a clean, dedicated trail to use. The communities consist of Fonda, Gilmore City, Havelock, Laurens, Palmer, Plover, Pocahontas, Rolfe, and Varina.

Our Rain Garden has been established and once we get our Walking Trail finished, we'll turn our sights to an Outdoor Amphitheater. Gilmore City might be small, but we're mighty! First Aid/CPR Class

The Gilmore City Ambulance will be hosting a First Aid/CPR class at the Fire Station. Anyone interested can sign up at City Hall. Date to be determined. Possibly 3rd week in August. Will post on Facebook when we have a date! The cost for the class will be \$22 per person. Whether you are interested in this for the first time or renewing an old certification, all are welcome.

Servline Leak Protection Program² 2 months ago you all received fliers in with your Utility bill called a leak protection program. This is an insurance policy in the event of a costly water bill caused by high water usage from leaks or line breakage. Servline covers the overage of your costly water bill once the leak has been repaired. Covering qualifying leaks occurring on your property providing up to \$2500 once every 12 months. Residential lines \$2.00 per month or Commercial lines \$5.55 a month. Everyone is on this program currently but if for some reason you would like to cancel or see what other value added services they carry, call 1-888-473-4013. All residents that have a high water bill and want to submit a claim please call the company to file that claim using the same phone number, 1-888-473-4013.
