ORDINANCE NO. 2013-02

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING DEMOLITION OF EXPLOSIVES IN GILMORE CITY, IOWA

CHAPTER 156 - EXPLOSIVES

SECTION 156-1 AREA - No explosives shall be permitted within the City limits of Gilmore City, Iowa or within an area one thousand three hundred eighty feet (1,380') outside the city limits in all directions. An exception to such detonation may be granted on prior petition to the City Council and upon a showing that such detonation is for the purpose of demolition, construction or removal of structures within the City or bounded area or pertain to an industrial or mining purpose. In the event industrial or mining purposes are desired, the applicant shall provide a detailed description of hours and dates of detonations, individuals responsible for handling explosives and shall list safeguards both as to the blast area and as to the municipality. The council reserves right to denv permission to detonate explosives in the event it determines in its best judgment that such function

customary terms contained in the Code of lowa and shall include but not be limited to dynamite, nitro glycerin, plastic explosives, petroleum derivatives, fireworks, blasting caps and military explosive and incendiary devises.

SECTION 156-3 MISDEMEAN-OR - It shall be a simple misdemeanor for any person or entity to detonate explosives within the area bounded by this ordinance. Each act of detonation shall be considered a separate and distinct violation of this

shall be considered a separate and distinct violation of this ordinance. This clause shall not restrict the City or private parties from seeking restitution and damages from violations.

Citations will be issued to those that don't follow city ordinances. If call sheets from Sheriff's dept are sent we will issue fines. If you have any uncertainties please call city hall, Thank you!
