Fall has started, leaves are falling and cooler weather is upon us. Thankfully most of the harvesting is done and tillage is all that's left in most areas. Thank you to our farmers for the safe 2021 harvest so that we may have a Thanksgiving feast! Here are a few City Code excerpts for the upcoming season. *Thank you, City Hall.*

BUILDING PERMITS-\$10.00

You must apply for a building permit **<u>BEFORE</u>** you begin construction on your project. This includes but is not limited to patios, decks, driveways and sheds. Permits are available at City Hall.

DOG LICENSES

All dogs are to be licensed annually with City Hall. Licenses are \$2.00 per year & must have current rabies certificate. It is unlawful for any owner to allow an animal to run at large within the corporate limits of the City. Dog tags must be purchased between Jan 1-Feb 28. March 1st they go to \$22.00.

BURNING OF LEAVES

CIT

As a friendly reminder to the citizens of Gilmore City, in accordance to City Ordnance Chapter 135.08 it is prohibited to burn trash, leaves, rubbish, or other combustible materials in any curb and gutter or on any paved or surfaced street or alley.

SNOW ORDINANCES

DUMPING OF SNOW 135.12

It is unlawful for any person to throw, push, or place or cause to be thrown, pushed or placed, any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the traveled way of a street or alley so as to obstruct gutters, or impede the passage of vehicles upon the street or alley or to

create a hazardous condition there-in; except where, in the cleaning of large commercial drives in the business district it is absolutely necessary to move the snow onto the street or alley temporarily, such accumulation shall be removed promptly by the property owner or agent. Arrangements for the prompt removal of such accumulations shall be made prior to moving the snow.

REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE, AND ACCUMULATIONS 136.03

The abutting property owner shall remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice, or accumulations within a reasonable time, the City may do so and assess the costs against the property owner for collection in the same manner as a property tax. The abutting property owner may be liable for damages caused by failure to remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from the sidewalk.

SNOW REMOVAL 69.09

No person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or Cityowned off-street parking area during the hours of 3 a.m. to 7 a.m. from November 1 to April 1.


