DOG LICENSES

The City of Gilmore City as a way to show compliance with State Code will provide a re-

quired City Dog License with proof of Rabies vaccinations. City Dog Licenses are good for one calendar year beginning in January and expiring in December of each year. Licenses are \$2 per dog through the month of January and up to the last business day of February. After that a late penalty charge of an additional \$20 plus tag fee will be incurred. Dogs found without the required licensing will be turned into the City impound and will incur additional fees and fines.

BURNING OF LEAVES

As a friendly reminder to the citizens of Gilmore City, in accordance to City Ordinance Chapter 135.08 it is prohibited to burn trash, leaves, rubbish, or other combustible materials in any curb and gutter or on any paved or surfaced street or alley. Leaves may be taken to the City Landfill and the guys will burn them.

City Hall & Library will be closed November 11th in Observance of Veteran's Day and November 24 & 25th in Observance of Thanksgiving. Library will be closed Sat the 26th as well. Both will resume normal hours Monday November 28th.

2022-2023 Home Energy Assistance Program

The 2022-2023 Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) has been established to help qualifying low-income Iowa homeowners and renters pay for a portion of their primary heating costs for the winter heating season. The assistance is based on household income, household size, type of fuel, and type of housing. To make an appointment to apply call UDMO:

WHEN TO APPLY:

- **Elderly (60 & over) and/or disabled -**
October 1, 2019 to April 30, 2020
- **All other households -**
November 1, 2019 to April 30, 2020
- **Reminder:** If you have already applied and been approved for this 2022-2023 winter season, you cannot re-apply.

WHAT TO TAKE:

- Proof of income (for all household members age 18, and over)
- Check stubs from the previous 30 days, preceding the date of application, or a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.
- Social Security numbers for all household members (documentation required)
- Recent heat bill
- Recent electric bill
- If you receive alimony or child support, it will also need to be verified
