WHY RECYCLE GLASSES?

An estimated 120 million people are visually impaired because of uncorrected refractive errors (far and near sightedness). Almost all cases can be corrected and normal vision can be restored with eyeglasses, contact lenses or refractive surgery. The lack of eyeglasses denies children and adults opportunities for education, employment and a better quality of life.

THE JOURNEY OF RECYCLED GLASSES

Lions collect used eyeglasses at various community locations. The glasses are then shipped to the nearest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center where trained volunteers sort, clean and de-

termine the prescription strengths of the glasses. Volunteers carefully package the prepared glasses and store them until they are required for eyeglass dispensing missions. Glasses that are not suitable for reuse are recycled for scrap with the earnings going towards other projects. At the site, Eye care professionals and trained volunteers perform vision screening and dispense the appropriate recycled glasses, free of charge to children and adults in need.

Starting this April, we will be launching a new online billing and payment service called Front Desk. This will offer you greater flexibility to view and pay your utility bills online. In addition, you will have options to enroll in AutoPay and receive Electronic notifications.

With Front Desk, you can look forward to being able to:

- Pay your utility bills any time with this easy-to-use online portal
- 24/7 access to your account including utility usage, tracking multiple accounts, and submitting service requests Manage your account and view usage and payment history
- Enroll in AutoPay with a credit card, debit card, or ACH information to avoid late or missed payments
- Get emails or texts from us when your bill is ready, when a payment is scheduled, and after
- Update your notification settings so you can receive other important messages and notifications from us
- Fill out and submit forms directly online and pay associated fees. Our staff will review and process the forms – no more paper required!
- Easy access to Public Notices and answers to Frequently Asked Questions so you can see important city-related information in one place.
- Review Meeting Agendas and Minutes.
- Use Citizen Requests to submit requests directly to the necessary government officials with a few clicks of a mouse or taps on a smartphone.

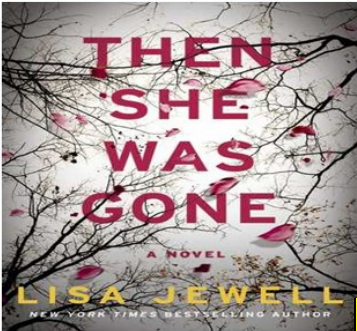
