FIREWORKS:

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-02 Definitions. The definitions enumerated in Iowa Code Section 727.2 and Iowa Code Section 100.19. are incorporated herein by refer-

 No sales of fireworks are to be sold within the city limits of Gilmore City, IA. Fireworks –Restrictions on

Discharging.A. No person shall discharge a consumer fireworks device with in the city limits outside the following dates and hours, July 3rd from 10 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. and July 4th from 10 a.m. until

11:00p.m. B. The City may, upon application

in writing, grant a permit for the display of display fireworks on public property by a City agency, fair associations, and such other organizations or groups of individuals ap-proved by City authorities when such display fireworks display will be han-dled by a licensed operator. No permit shall be granted hereunder unless the operator or sponsoring organization has filed with the City evidence of insurance as required under lowa Code Section 727.2 and under this Chapter.

C. Sky lantern open flame devices are not permitted to be released within the city limits.

Manufacture of Fireworks. It shall be unlawful for a person to manufacture fireworks within the city limits without a permit as may be required by local, state, or federal laws and regulations

Violations.

All violations of any provisions of this Chapter may be prosecuted by the City either as simple misdemeanors or municipal infractions. A landowner who knowingly allows persons to discharge fireworks on their property in violation of this Ordinance shall also be deemed to be in violation. Violations of this chapter shall be reported to the state fire marshal. The fines for violating any section of
This ordinance after 1st warning shall
be the following:

a. First Offense: \$250

b. Second Offense: \$500 c. Third & Final Offense:\$1,000


