

Rolfe Regular Council Meeting
Monday September 14, 2020
Rolfe Community Center, 5:30pm

Mayor Tom Andersen called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm and took roll call. Council present Ryan Peters, Jon Wellik, Rick Jones and Kris Trenary absent Carrie Frerk. Clerk stated that the building purchase resolution should be #659 and SFR resolution should be #660. Trenary had questions on budget and revenue reports and vendor bills and comments.

Peters/Trenary moved to approve consent agenda including agenda, bills, corrected August 11, 2020 minutes and building permit for Sandvig and Sauter. All ayes.

De Sindergard gave treasurer's report for the month of August. Wellik/Jones moved to approve treasurer's report. All ayes.

No council or clerk comments. Mayor commented that come November he will probably retire from the Mayor position.

Utility reports. – Gas survey handed out for council to fill out. IAMU here this week to train Vigdal.

Tom Macrunnel or Jennifer Sproston not present. No action taken.

Mayor gave update that the deputy sheriff and the county attorney are working on the 28E agreements. Discussion on the 28E agreement verses City's own police department.

Discussion on a water service line repair. Confusion on whose service line. Sindergard's were called in by city employee. Jones/Wellik moved to pay the bill for the repair. All ayes.

Rich Welter purposed putting a fence at one lot for storage of equipment and graveling another lot for parking. He would like these lots to be changed to non-residential. Trenary questions on why the change to non-residential. Discussion on time frame. Peters/Jones moved to change these three lots to non-residential. Ayes: Wellik, Peters, Jones and Trenary.

Discussion on Sandvig what can and cannot be done with public fund. Jones/Peters moved to purchase a recognition plaque. All ayes.

Discussion on Trick or Treat night. City Clerks have been discussing this topic and most cities are leaving it to the residents and parents own discretion unless the Governor cancels it. Council is in consensus to go forward with Trick or Treat as usual at the discretion of the residents and parents if they choose to take part.

Discussion with City Employee's having a cleanup day. Peters/Wellik to set Clean Up day to October 12th. Everything has to be on the curb by October 12th to be picked up. All Ayes.

Camera system was down. Support finally called back and was able to repair system at no charge. No action needed.

Discussion on next steps for 320 Garfield Street, clerk stated we would need to get a preliminary engineering report so can move forward with getting a grant to restore the building. Jones/Wellik moved to have a preliminary engineering report completed. All ayes.

Nuisance abatements update – have not done any new due to Covid restrictions in the courts. Probably will start again, if someone wants to compile a list.

Peters/Jones moved to adjourn at 6:26pm. All ayes.
