

Rolfe Regular Council Meeting/Public Hearing
Monday, March 8, 2021
Rolfe Community Center, 5:30 p.m.

Mayor Tom Andersen called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and took roll call. Council present Ryan Peters, Jon Wellik, Rick Jones, Kris Trenary and Carrie Frerk.

Wellik/Peters moved to approve the consent agenda including agenda, bills, and February 8th, February 16 and March 3, 2021 minutes. All ayes.

De Sindergard gave Treasurer's report for February 2021. Jones/Wellik moved to approve Treasurer's reports. All ayes.

Jones/ Wellik moved to approve Rolfe Golf Course liquor license. All ayes.

Mayor opened bids for old police cruiser from Charlie McEleroy, Ryan Peters and Denny Wagner.

Wellik/Jones moved to accept the bid from Ryan Peters in the amount of \$500.00 for the police cruiser.

Ayes: Frerk, Trenary, Jones and Wellik. Peters abstained due to conflict of interest.

Peters/Frerk set date for cleanup days for April 12th and 13th. All ayes.

Recycling center – reiterated from earlier in comments to try to keep clear of ice.

Nuisance abatements – council has concerns of condition of Rodeo Property would like to review the agreement at next meeting.

Wellik/Jones moved to adjourn at 6:42 p.m. All ayes.
